Tools for pressing — Guide pillar mountings

1 Scope

This International Standard specifies the dimensions and tolerances, in millimetres, of guide pillar mountings intended for mounting with or without guide bush.

It also specifies the material and the designation of guide pillar mountings that are in accordance with its specifications.

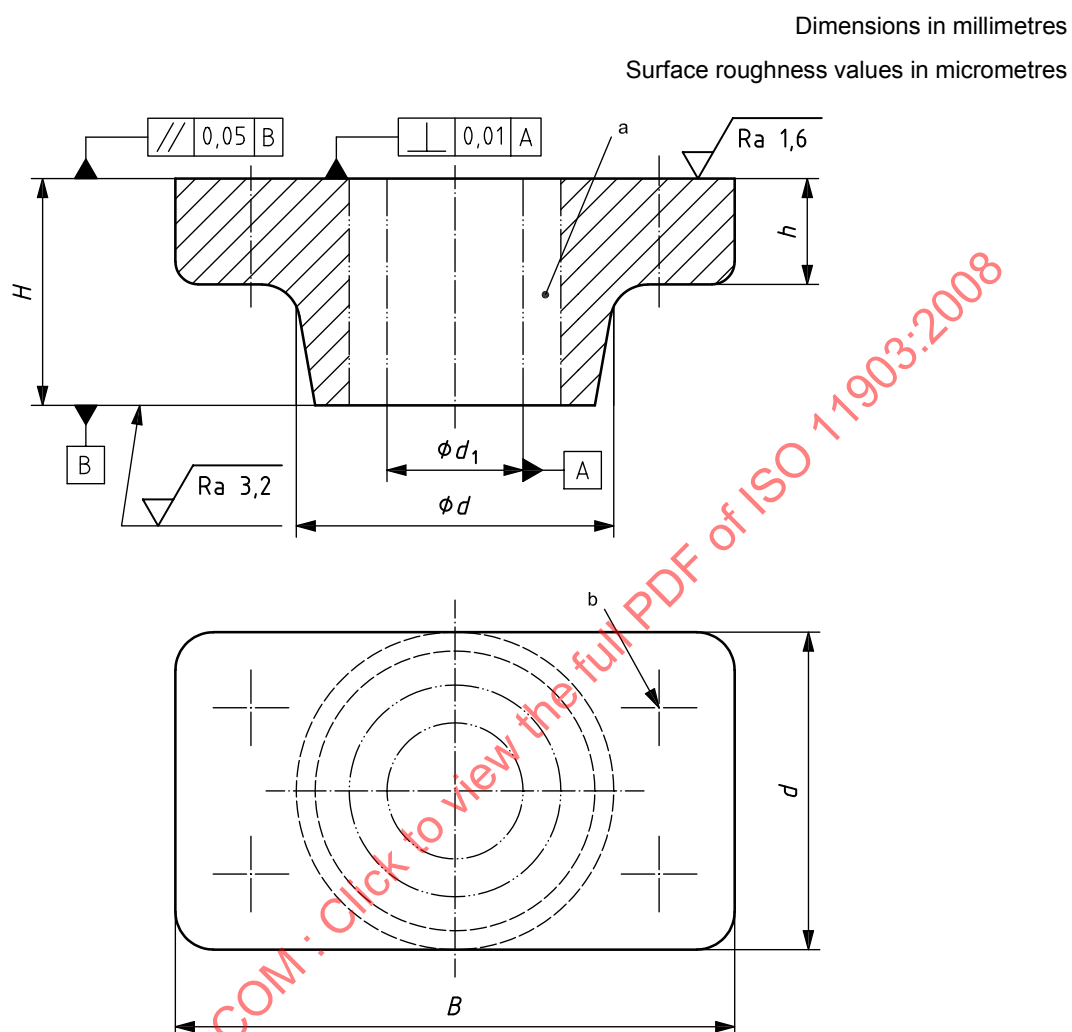

3 Dimensions

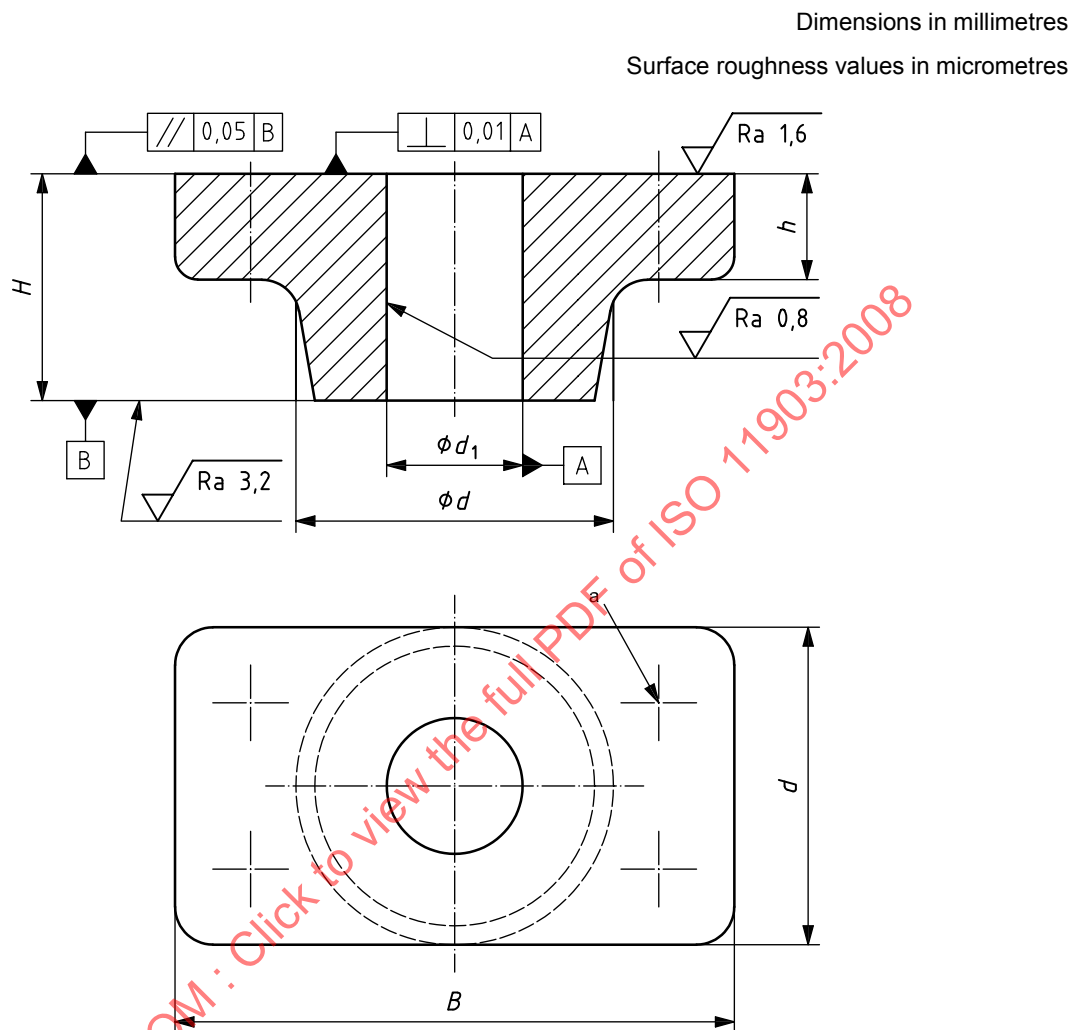
The dimensions of guide pillar mountings with bush shall conform to the indications in Figure 1 and Table 1.



- a The bush is left to the manufacturer's discretion.
 b The mounting holes are left to the manufacturer's discretion.

The dimensions of guide pillar mountings without bush shall conform to the indications in Figure 2 and Table 1.

^a To prevent incorrect assembly of the upper and lower plates of the die set in relation to each other, the following values of d_1 are recommended: 11, 15, 19, 24, 30, 38 and 48.

4 Material

Guide pillar mountings shall be manufactured from grey cast iron ISO 185/JL/250 as defined in ISO 185 or from any material with equivalent mechanical characteristics.

5 Designation

Guide pillar mountings in accordance with this International Standard shall be designated by the following:

- “Guide pillar mounting”;
- reference to this International Standard, i.e. ISO 11903;
- guide pillar diameter d_1 in millimetres;
- when applicable, identification of guide bush.

EXAMPLE The designation for a guide pillar mounting without bush, with guide pillar diameter $d_1 = 25$, is as follows:
