Human behaviour that is intended to be caused after understanding the public information symbol's meaning Finding a facility suitable for changing the diaper or nappy of a disabled adult or large child.	
Need Baby changing and regular toilet areas are not typically suitable for changing the diaper or nappy of disabled people larger than infants. As changing areas suitable for adults and larger children are added to public restrooms and other facilities, signage is needed to identify these areas and assist the user population in finding them.
