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## BRIEF HISTORY

The ISO Recommendation R 1731, *Dictation equipment – Classification*, was drawn up by Technical Committee ISO/TC 95, *Office machines*, the Secretariat of which is held by the Ente Nazionale Italiano di Unificazione (UNI).

Work on this question led to the adoption of Draft ISO Recommendation No. 1731, which was circulated to all the ISO Member Bodies for enquiry in October 1968. It was approved, subject to a few modifications of an editorial nature, by the following Member Bodies :

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## DICTATION EQUIPMENT

### CLASSIFICATION

#### 1. SCOPE

This ISO Recommendation provides a system of classification of dictation equipment by which users may recognize or identify a machine according to its characteristics, expressed in the form of a code.

#### 2. PRINCIPLES OF CLASSIFICATION

- 2.1 Each property or function of a machine is given a cypher or group of cyphers, so that by selecting the appropriate combination or succession of cyphers any particular machine can be indicated completely by means of a series of letters and numbers.
- 2.2 These cyphers are shown diagrammatically in the Figure so that they can be more easily read and selected.
- 2.3 The ultimate order in which the properties of dictation equipment are set out – and hence the ultimate choice of cyphers – should follow the order and style in which it is agreed to define the appropriate terms.
- 2.4 The proposed system of classification set out numerically in section 3 and shown diagrammatically in the Figure illustrates the principle described above. It may be modified, as necessary, as decisions are taken later concerning definitions and terminology.
- 2.5 As an example, using this proposed system of classification, a magnetic-tape, mains-operated machine, for office dictation only, would be described as :
